The Fourth Man in the Furnace
"Did we not cast three men bound into the fire?...Lo, I see four men loose, walking in the midst of the fire, and they have no hurt; and the form of the fourth is like the Son of God."—Daniel 3:24–25

Babylon Thought It Burned Alone

Shadrach. Meshach. Abednego.

Three men. One fire. A wicked king. A golden idol. A command: **Bow or burn.**

But the sons of Israel knew something greater than fear. They knew the scroll written in their bones:

"We will not bow. Even if He does not deliver, we will not serve your gods."

But There Was a Fourth

Chapter 4

"My God, My God, why hast Thou forsaken Me?"—Psalm
22:1 / Matthew 27:46

The Cross Was Sung Before It Was Seen

Long before the nails, before the thorns, before Golgotha had a name—Jesus was already crying out in the Psalms.

Written a thousand years before the crucifixion, David's psalms were not just songs of pain or praise—they were **prophetic utterances** from the Spirit of the Christ to come.

The Psalms do not merely point to Jesus. They echo Him.

Psalm 22 — The Crucifixion Revealed

This is not symbolic. This is specific. This is surgical revelation.

Psalm 22:1

"My God, My God, why hast Thou forsaken Me?"—Jesus would cry this from the cross.

Psalm 22:7-8

"All they that see Me laugh Me to scorn... saying, He trusted on the Lord that He would deliver Him..."—The same words spoken by those mocking Him at Calvary.

Psalm 22:16

Psalm 22:18

Jesus Was Already Bleeding in the Spirit

He carried the cross before He touched wood. He cried out before He wore the crown. He was forsaken in the Psalms—so that you would be *accepted* through His blood.

The Psalms Reveal His Humanity and His Divinity

He weeps like a man. He trusts like a Son. He declares victory like a King.

Psalm 16:10

"Thou wilt not leave My soul in hell; neither wilt Thou suffer Thy Holy One to see corruption."—Resurrection was already written.

Psalm 110:1

"The Lord said unto my Lord, Sit at My right hand..."—Ascension and enthronement foretold.

Psalm 2:12

"Kiss the Son, lest He be angry, and ye perish from the way..."—A warning to kings and nations. Not just poetry—**prophecy.**

The Psalms Are a Hidden Gospel

Not four chapters, but **150 prophetic windows** into the sufferings and glory of the Messiah.

Jesus is in the melodies. He is in the weeping. He is in the vengeance. He is in the vindication.

And the Cross was never a surprise. It was a song.

Prophetic Declaration

Chapter 5

Jesus in the Prophets



he Suffering and the Reigning One
"To Him give all the prophets witness..."—Acts 10:43"For the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy."—Revelation 19:10

The Prophets All Saw Him — From Different Angles, Same Fire

They prophesied of justice. They prophesied of judgment. But woven through their groans was the coming of One who would bear both:

A Lamb and a Lion. A Servant and a Sovereign. One despised—yet adored. One crushed—yet crowned.

Isaiah: The Prophet Who Saw the Cross Before the Cradle
Isaiah 7:14

"Behold, a virgin shall conceive..."—The miraculous entry point.

Isaiah 9:6

"For unto us a child is born... and His name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God..."—Both child *and* God. Son *and* Sovereign.

Isaiah 53The most detailed vision of Jesus' crucifixion—700 years before it happened:

"He was despised and rejected... a man of sorrows... wounded for our transgressions...The Lord hath laid on Him the iniquity of us all... He was led as a lamb to the slaughter..."

Not metaphor. Not symbolism. **It was Jesus.** Every line, every lash, every bruise—seen in full.

And Isaiah concludes:

"He shall see the travail of His soul, and be satisfied..." Jesus would suffer—but He would see the harvest.

Jeremiah: The Weeping Mirror of the Messiah

Jeremiah wept for a nation that would not hear. So did Jesus.

Jeremiah was rejected by kings. So was Jesus.

Jeremiah spoke of a **new covenant**:

"I will write My law upon their hearts..." —Jeremiah 31:33

Jesus would **fulfill that covenant** with His blood.

The tears of Jeremiah were the tears of Jesus in Gethsemane. The fire shut up in Jeremiah's bones was the Word made flesh.

Jesus would quote this verse before the high priest. And they would tear their garments—because He was claiming the throne of Daniel's vision.

Daniel saw **Jesus crowned** before the earth saw Him crucified.

Zechariah: The Prophet of the Pierced One Zechariah 12:10

"They shall look upon Me whom they have pierced..."A direct prophecy of the crucifixion—spoken by God through Zechariah.

He foresaw the mourning of Israel, the pierced hands, and the fountain opened for sin and uncleanness.

Every Prophet Carried a Piece of the Scroll

- Moses said: "A Prophet like unto me shall the Lord raise up..." (Deut. 18:15)
- Hosea said: "Out of Egypt I called My Son..."
- Micah said: "Out of Bethlehem shall He come forth..."
- Malachi said: "The Lord whom you seek shall suddenly come to His temple..."

None of them contradicted. All of them confirmed. Jesus was the fire behind the words.

Prophetic Declaration

I declare that Jesus is the thread of the prophets—the Word they heard, the vision they bore, the scroll they carried.

He is the suffering Servant and the reigning King. The One who fulfilled every line. The fire behind every dream. The face in every flame.

Let every prophet's voice be honored. Let every false prophet be silenced. Let the true Spirit of prophecy return to the Church—the Spirit who reveals Jesus.

Chapter 6 Jesus in the Flesh



The Word Made Visible

"And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth."—John 1:14

From Scroll to Skin

What the prophets saw in part, what the psalmists sang in shadows, what the heavens declared in silence—was now **wrapped in swaddling cloth.**

The Word didn't send a representative. The Word became flesh.

Not visited—incarnated. Not adopted—begotten. Not appearing—dwelling.

Jesus didn't come to resemble man. He became one.

He Was Born of a Virgin, But Sent from the Throne

The cradle in Bethlehem was not His origin. It was His *entry point*.

"Without the shedding of blood, there is no remission of sins."—Hebrews 9:22"Having made peace through the blood of His cross..."—Colossians 1:20

This Is the Center of the Scroll

From Genesis to Revelation—every shadow pointed here. Every altar. Every priest. Every sacrifice.

Even the tree in Eden whispered of it.

This is not a symbol. This is not an option. This is the *only place* where sin dies and sons rise.

Chapter 20 Jesus the Alpha and Omega

Alpha and Omega Are the First and Last Letters
